From first time director Tom Volf, MARIA BY CALLAS: IN HER OWN WORDS is the definitive documentary on the life and work of the Greek-American opera singer. Volf has spent nearly five years working on the film, which features never before seen or heard footage and performances of Callas.

The new documentary about the world-famous soprano avoids going in-depth into Maria Callas' personal struggles, instead telling the story in her own words.

While numerous books have been written about the tumultuous life of Callas, Volf largely focuses on a story showing the positive aspects of her life, one he thinks she herself would have approved.

Volf said that the film doesn't show her as a superficial, smiling, kind lady. I think the film portrays her as she was. So perhaps the film gives an image less scandalous and less gossipy than what people could have had about Callas, but that was the point about having the film from her own point of view because that is the idea. So at that point it's subjective what you as the public can judge. But you can judge only from her side.



The middle of a forest in Portland is the unlikely setting for this touching story from writer director Debra Granik as it explores the bond between father and daughter. Here, Ben Foster's troubled war veteran, Will and his teenage daughter Tom (Thomasin Harcourt McKenzie) live in their own little bubble outside society. Just as Granik showed her eye for spotting talent when she cast Jennifer Lawrence in the tough drama Winter's Bone (2010), spring-boarding her to stardom, she has found a gem in the talented New Zealand teenager, whose performance is nothing short of astonishing.

This is a film that appeals to an intelligent audience and one who appreciates arthouse films and powerful emotional journeys. Production elements are excellent, especially the denseness of the green forest that has been home to this father and daughter, which in turn reflects the denseness of their relationship.
