The Grizzlies is an inspiring true story based on a group of Inuit students in a small Arctic town. Suffering from widespread drug use, alcohol abuse, domestic violence and one of the highest teen suicide rates in the world, this northern community is periled by the legacy of colonialism.

The director and cinematographer Jim Denault expertly conveys the bleak beauty of the Arctic landscape. The filmmakers wisely chose to shoot on harsh real locations, and they add immeasurably to the movie's portrayal of the impediments to these young men's survival. It turns out to be bracingly unsentimental and transcendently moving at the same time.

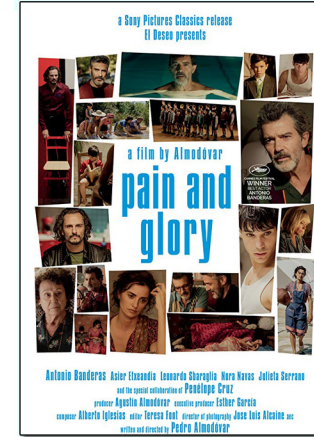
